F&B MEMBER'S PROJECT REPORT - POUTUA RESERVE WALKWAY, Summerhill, P.North

In March last year a notice was posted on the branch newsletter asking for volunteers to look after an area of Poutua Reserve walkway at Summerhill.

The purpose of the project is to improve and maintain the area and, in due course, have signage erected showing that the work has been undertaken by local Forest and Bird members and so be a means to promote Forest and Bird.

Since April last year seven regular volunteers have met every second Friday morning for 2 hours and have in fact succeeded in doing a larger area than originally intended.

The group has had the support of Palmerston North City Council and Todd Palenski (Contractor to PNCC), providing over 1000 plants, and assisting with ground preparation (getting rid of gorse and blackberry) and planting.

Donations from members of wool from food delivery boxes have been gratefully received and used as mulch around plants.

It is intended to continue with further plantings, especially native trees at the Ruapehu Drive end of Poutua. Most of the plantings so far have been 2 varieties of flax, cabbage trees, carrex grasses and muhlenbeckia. The plants are thriving, and the team is looking forward to planting time again in winter.
