Hone Morris will talk about the *Tū te Manawa* project which hopes to encourage whanau to reconnect with the river and become active in the mahi to restore the health of the awa, demonstrate the value of hapū, iwi and communities working together and teach future generations about the river and the land. The project involves the erection of 8 educational kiosks (Whare Mātauranga) along the length of the Manawatū river. The kiosks will hold information for the public to learn about each site historically, the sentinel species and to become intimately involved with assisting in the monitoring and the restoration of the health of the Manawatū and its tributaries.

- Then to Dannevirke to visit the Kaitoki-Hori Herehere Reserve (see the above photo) where we will have lunch.
- Finishing at Ferry Reserve at the entrance of the Gorge. Te Waha o Te Kuri Whare, Ferry Reserve (Historical and view plantings)
