Talk: Albatross conservation and the future of ecotourism in NZ Speaker: Anne-Sophie Pagé, F&B Committee Member, Massey University



The success of New Zealand's tourism industry is a result of three unique components; scenery, culture and wildlife. Having grown up on the Otago Peninsula, Anne-Sophie Pagé has always considered species such as the Northern Royal Albatross and Yellow Eyed Penguin fellow locals. However, with six years of wildlife guiding behind her, it is becoming evident that uncontrolled tourism and wildlife can no longer coexist.

This presentation will provide insights on how New Zealand wildlife, if approached in the right way, can be used as a tool in fostering emotional connections with the environment which is crucial in the fight against climate change.
