

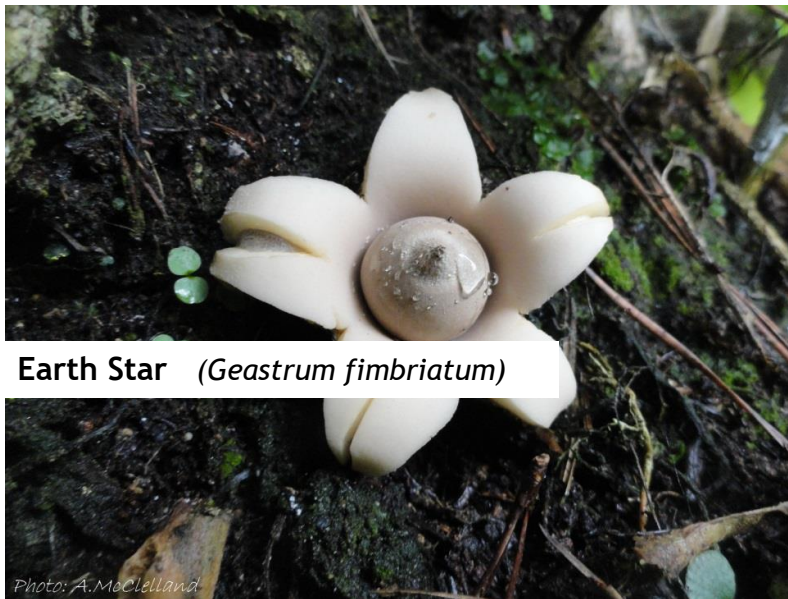

The Fern Walk in the Pohangina Valley will take you through beautiful native bush, with lots of native trees to see, including totara, rimu kahikatea and black beech.

Suliana will talk about the fungi found on the walk.

Depart: 0900 a.m. - sharp

Meet: Car pool - meet on Church St, opposite Salvation Army Shop (on Railway land side). If you carpool, please share petrol costs with the driver.

Please take: Water, lunch/snacks, raincoat, stout footwear and a walking pole if you usually use one.

Note: The track is located in the Pohangina Valley about 30 minutes' drive from Palmerston North. From Ashhurst, drive north along Pohangina Road, then turn right onto Pohangina Valley East Road.

Keep your eye out for the signage for the Fern Walk - you will see a small car park on the side of the road, just before the Totara Reserve.
